An Open Letter to Hon Jeremiah Rusk

Hon Jeremiah Rusk, Secretary of Agriculture, Washington DC. - *Dear Sir:* We understand there is an appropriation of \$2,000 to bring rain. We would feel very much obliged to you if you would send a portion to Caledonia, Columbia Co, Wisconsin, on account of the severe drouth prevailing here. The high Baraboo Bluffs, from which the dynamite could be fired, would be one of the best points on which to conduct the experiments and would warrant their success, so that coming congresses may be more liberal in appropriations, if they don't become Democratic. There are many old soldiers in the town who have seen service for our country's safety and these could conduct the experiments and so you could be sure that they were fairly conducted and all directions completely followed. Our townsmen have been observing your movements in the political field with great pleasure and if you should be fortunate as to receive the next Republican presidential nomination you may be sure of our hearty support and co-operation if you will kindly grant the above request. We are your respectful and obedient servants. CITIZENS OF CALEDONIA
